Zion UMC Beacon March/April 2018 "Where Can We Find Comfort?"



Ever feel like the trials and tribulations of this world are way too quick in finding you and causing you grief? I know the feeling! When those times come—and they will come—where can we find comfort? Glad you asked.

The apostle Paul is an example of what can happen to a person's mind and life when they have been touched and changed by the love of God. Paul shows us how rich our lives can be when we learn to find our security and peace in "the Father of mercies and the God of all comfort." He also shows us how much fulfillment we find after we've been changed by the love of God. That's when we become more concerned about the needs of others than we are about ourselves. With this in mind, Paul praises the God ... "who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves received from God. For just as the sufferings of Christ flow over into our lives, so also through Christ our comfort overflows." (2 Corinthians 1:4-5).

Paul reminds us that God has a special interest in comforting those who are willing to join with Jesus in caring for others. In another New Testament letter, he writes: "I now rejoice in what was suffered for you, and I fill up in my flesh what is still lacking in regard to Christ's afflictions, for the sake of this body, which is the church." (Colossians 1:24)

In other words, Christ alone has suffered to pay the price for our sins. No one else could do that. The work of the cross was finished once and for all! What the apostle Paul <u>could</u> do (and what we can do with God's help) is to join with Christ Jesus in a willingness to live for the interests of others. Like Christ, Paul put his own temporary well-being on the line to go to the rescue of those who needed help. Where does our comfort come from? It comes from the Lord and it comes so we can share it with others.

As we celebrate this Season of Lent 2018, let's fast a meal and feed someone who is hungry; fast TV and gain time to help others; Volunteer; Visit; Mentor; There is much to do. Simply create a plan and stick to it!




Flocks of Chicks for Heifer

Since 1944, Heifer International has worked to bring help, healing, and hope to millions of impover-ished families worldwide. With help from donors, in just over 70 years, they have assisted, directly or indirectly, more than 31 million families. Today they are working in more than 25 countries and in areas where hunger and despair once prevailed. Heifer programs have

reinvigorated communities through livestock, training, and Passing on the Gift.

During the Lenten season, the people of Zion will again have the opportunity to support Heifer International. As we have done for many years, we are working to donate a specific item for Heifer. In the past, Zion's gifts have included water buffalo, fish fingerlings, bees, rabbits, and actual heifers. This year, we are planning to donate flocks of chickens at a cost of \$20 each.



The protein in just one egg is a nutritious gift for a hungry child. Heifer helps many hungry families with a starter flock of 10 to 50 chicks. And since a good hen can lay up to 200 eggs a year, there are plenty of eggs for families to eat, share, or sell. Because chickens require little space and can thrive on readily available food scraps, families can make money from the birds without spending much. Plus, chickens help control insects and fertilize gardens.

A container will be in the back of the sanctuary during Lent for any contributions people would like to make. Our congregation has always been very supportive of Heifer in the past, and will hopefully be just as supportive this year. I had intended to send a personal note to each one who contacted me, but when I turned on my computer and saw the reams of messages, I realize that I'm not going to be able to do that. Even though this is a form note, I want you to know how much I appreciate your loving kindness! What a joy to have each one of you in my life!

I have been surrounded by love, prayer, very competent and caring medical professionals at Easton Memorial Hospital, which is part of the University of Maryland Shore Health System. There was nothing I wanted or needed that wasn't immediately provided. The food was amazing! You got a complete menu with a number to call the chef. You placed your order and told them when you wanted it and voila, it arrived right on time. I've never been in a hospital that did anything like that before.

Very impressive!

Mom's regular caregiver, Heather, rearranged her schedule so that she could be here Monday and Tuesday, rather than having someone Mom didn't know come in on Monday. Heather is such a blessing to us.

Pastor Mike Hurley visited Mom on Monday and me on Tuesday. What a blessing that was to all of us!

Craig has been caregiver par excellence! He's done everything that needs to be done and much more. Actually, he's almost single-handedly been caring For Mom for weeks now. Mom is not bedridden and she can feed herself (and she definitely knows how to get the foil off of the Hershey Kisses!), but she needs significant help with everything else. Craig has done an amazing job, just as you would expect.

I have a three month recovery ahead. The first three weeks I cannot drive. And the first two weeks I'm supposed to rest and relax. That will be a challenge for me! I don't do "sit and stay" well! But I will definitely abide by doctor's orders. So far, so good, and I don't want to create any complications.
